The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Airedale hospital provides level 2A service which includes provision of inpatient chemotherapy for haematology patients. Majority of treatment however is delivered as an outpatient with the Haematology / Oncology teams working closely with the Haemato-Oncology Day Unit (HODU) and the Acute Assessment Unit (AAU) where most of the out of hours acute admissions occur. The FY2 will be involved in daily management of Haematology inpatients under close supervision from the Consultants or Middle Grade / SpR doctor, participate in MDT ward rounds on Tuesday and Friday mornings and present / discuss clinical cases, when able. It would also be expected for the FY2 to assess new admissions from HODU and provide medical cover on the day unit, when required, with input from senior medical staff.

Main duties of the placement	The Haematology/ Oncology FY2 will be based on Ward 19

	Grade / SpR. Responsibilities include: Day to day care of all
	patients on the ward (admission, clerking and assessment,
	daily or more frequent clinical review if required, prescribing,
	requesting investigations and acting upon abnormal results in
	a timely manner).
	Provision of medical care to HODU patients if necessary,
	under supervision of the responsible Consultant or SpR.
	The FY2 would not be involved in intrathecal chemotherapy
	or to make decisions on patient treatment without input from
	senior medical staff.
	The FY2 would participate in discussion and clinical care of
	patients and if able, to present cases at MDT ward rounds.
	Discharge planning and e-discharge notifications.
	Maintain patient safety by abiding by the Medicines Code,
	Infection Prevention procedures and Medical Equipment/
	Devices policy, mandatory training etc.
	The responsible FY2 would also provide review of sick
	patients of other medical teams on ward 19 inputting into
	their care.
	Clerking of new admissions and ward based duties as
