The department does not see paediatric patients nor those involved in major trauma.</li> <li>The department has a 12 bed clinical decision unit (CDU) with an associated observation area supporting the delivery of a number of short stay and ambulatory patient care pathways and protocols including minor head injury, PE, DVT, low risk cardiac chest pain etc.</li> <li>The department also has an active minor injuries unit seeing ambulatory walk-in patients with minor injury and illness.</li> </ul>                                  |
