Main Duties of the placement	The trainee on J27 and J28 is responsible for taking histories and examining newly admitted patients, planning their investigations, and carrying out the initial treatment of those patients under supervision. Cases are then presented to the consultant on the consultant ward round. Work on the specialty wards (J7, J8, J14, J15, J17) consists of daily patient reviews and completing tasks arising - with supervision from Consultants and/or registrars. There is also an emphasis on holistic care and communicating early with relatives and carers.
Typical working pattern in this placement	The F2s operate a full shift system, comprising normal days, long days or nights, and covering shifts on the admissions unit.
