Main duties of the placement	<p>Admitting acute, unselected medical patients and dealing with the acutely ill medical patients.</p> <p>Daily sessions in the Acute Medicine Unit (AMU), where the doctor admits new patients, assists with the management of in-patients and attends two daily Consultant (on-call) ward rounds. There will also be senior doctors reviewing patients and the constant support of the middle grade doctor on-call. The post offers excellent exposure to acute (internal) medicine and allows the post holder to maximise their exposure and experience.</p>
