This is an active department with access to a wide range of investigations which includes transthoracic and transoesophageal echo, nuclear cardiac imaging, stress testing, full range of diagnostic rhythm recorders, coronary angiography and permanent pacing.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The areas of specific cardiological interest that will be covered include managing Acute Coronary Syndromes, Heart Failure, Valvular Heart Disease and Cardiac Arrhythmia as well as many others relevant to general internal medicine. Practical experience to be gained will include ECG interpretation and Central Venous Cannulation opportunities may arise during this attachment.
