Grade	F1
Placement	Respiratory Medicine
Department	Each ward team is responsible for up to a maximum of 30 patients. Patients are admitted direct from ED or transferred from AMU with acute respiratory conditions including COPD, asthma, Pulmonary embolism, Pneumonia, lung cancer, and interstitial lung diseases. There is a specialized Respiratory Acute Care Unit for severe respiratory disease including the provision of non-invasive ventilation. Excellent support from Allied Health professionals including pharmacists, Specialist physio, OT, SLT, and Physician Associate
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Day-to-day care of in-patients. Normally each FY1 is allocated a group of 10-15 patients to be primarily responsible for, but works together as a team with other FY1s and CMT on ward. 1 week in 9 is spent of the RCU which gives excellent experience of acute severe respiratory disease. Learning opportunities: - Daily consultant Ward rounds (include teaching) - Hospital FY1 teaching Tuesday lunchtime -Thursday lunchtime Consultant/SpR/AHP led session covering respiratory medicine. - Friday lunchtime X-ray meeting. - Unit meeting: Journal club/Evidence medical based presentations/Case presentations/Audit.

Main duties of the placement	-Day-to-day care of in-patients -Clerking of new admissions -Reviewing of sick patients and inputting into their care - on-call evening or long day shifts and weekends

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Typical working pattern in this placement	General: - Daily consultant ward round in morning - Afternoon ward work Rota - Long day (09:00- 21:30) or evening (13:30-212:30) shifts 2 in 9 weekdays - 1 weekend in 9 long days respiratory wards - 1 weekend evening shifts covering elderly medicine wards - No night shifts
