Department	<p>The department provides in patient (and outpatient) care for acute respiratory diseases including a regional centrecystic fibrosis. Cystic fibrosis patients are admitted directly to J06</p> <p>General respiratory patients are admitted direct from ED or transferred from AMU with acute respiratory conditions including COPD, asthma, Pulmonary embolism, Pneumonia, lung cancer, and interstitial lung diseases. There is a specialized Respiratory Acute Care Unit for severe respiratory disease including the provision of non-invasive ventilation.</p> <p>Excellent support from Allied Health professionals including pharmacists, Specialist nurses, physio, OT, SLT, and Physician Associate</p>
