Placement	Surgery
Department	The Department of General Surgery serves a population of 230,000 and provides care to elective and emergency patients. Elective subspecialty care in Colorectal, Upper GI and Breast Surgery is provided as well as emergency and elective care across the broader range of general surgical presentations. There are two main surgical inpatient wards, supported by a recently expanded Intensive Care Unit. Acute admissions are assessed in Surgical SDEC (Same Day Emergency Care) where acute care and suitability for admission is planned under senior guidance.

<p>Main duties of the placement</p>	<p>Main Duties:</p> <p>Standard shift:</p> <p>Provision of ward cover for elective and emergency inpatients:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • attendance at ward rounds • organization of appropriate investigations • collection and interpretation of results • liaison with senior team members, patients and families • assessment of acutely deteriorating patients • theatre attendance can be tailored to the availability of ward cover and trainee interests <p>On call shift:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assessment of emergency referrals predominantly in the surgical SDEC • Formulation of early management plans • Provision of out-of-hours ward cover • liaison with senior team members, patients and families • Attendance at emergency surgical procedures <p>All duties are undertaken with multiple tiers of available senior supervision.</p>
<p>Typical working pattern in this placement</p>	<p>Annual leave is arranged via an electronic rostering system overseen by medical staffing.</p> <p>The average contracted hours must not be exceeded. However, in exceptional circumstances, F2 doctors shall be expected within their contract and job description to cover for the occasional brief absence of colleagues and emergency situations as far as is practicable.
