<p>The Clinical Skills & Interventions (CSI) Course aims to cover a number of key clinical skills (cannulation, lumbar puncture, assessment of the unwell patient) combined with an introduction to point of care ultrasound (US).</p> <p>By the end of the course you will be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Describe basic venous and arterial anatomy of the upper limb • Refine your current peripheral IV Cannulation technique • Explain how ultrasound (US) works and how it can be used clinically to increase venous cannulation success in difficult patients • Demonstrate US guided venous cannulation on Blue Phantom Models in preparation for gaining US guided peripheral IV Cannulation competency • Describe how point of care ultrasound (POCUS) may be used to manage two acutely unwell patients: The Collapsed Patient and The Acutely BreathLess Patient • Describe basic spinal and epidural anatomy relevant to Lumbar Puncture • Refine your current Lumbar Puncture Landmark technique to increase success • Describe how US may assist Lumbar Puncture success in difficult patients
