Placement	Acute Hospital Paediatrics
Department	The Paediatric department at Barnsley Hospital provides inpatient paediatric care on the Children's ward and there are 14 Neonatal cots, which include intensive care, HDU and special care cots. There are almost daily outpatient general paediatric clinics including a number of specialist outreach clinics in addition to the Community Paediatric team run clinics at New Street Health Centre and peripheral outreach clinics. On call rota provision provided by: Second on Call Paediatric Specialist Trainees (ST4+) Speciality Doctors on both tiers First on call GP VTS and Paediatric Specialist Trainees 2 Foundation 2 post (FY2) 3 Foundation 1 posts (FY1)

Where the placement is based	Within the Paediatric departments at Barnsley Hospital.
Educational and Clinical Supervisor(s) for the placement	Dr J Dales, Dr A Low
Main duties of the placement	The work involves ward work on the Children's ward, postnatal ward and neonatal unit. Attendance will be required at some deliveries. CAU duties will include clerking admissions referred from General Practitioners and from ED and other Departments in the hospital. Work will be performed under the direct supervision of the tier 2 doctors (ST4+). Specific duties may vary with the circumstances from time to time and the developing competence and interest of members of the firm. Range of roles includes: • to attend and participate in handover, ward rounds, outpatient clinics, Children's Assessment unit, attend deliveries and postnatal wards, SCBU. • to arrange investigations (x-ray, pathology, etc) as may be necessary

	• to carry the paediatric or neonatal crash bleep as part of the relevant teams • to attend and participate in educational meetings • to keep such records as may be required for medical and/or administrative reasons • to encourage and teach medical students • to participate in QI work • to communicate with patients, their relatives, family doctors and other health and social services colleagues. This includes immediate liaison with the consultants and other more senior staff. • there will also be opportunities to gain skills in paediatric blood taking and cannulation
Typical working pattern in this placement	This post complies with the “New Deal”. EWTD compliant rota with full shift is used. In each cycle of the rota there is a combination of cover during the day time, the evening periods and nights. Handovers between shifts are for 45 minutes in the morning and 30 minutes in the evening and at night.
