Department	<p>-The Emergency department at SJUH sees approximately 350 patients a day. It is the receiving hospital for patients presenting by ambulance with acute medical, elderly, respiratory, surgical and gynaecology conditions. It will also see patients self-presenting with the full spectrum of Emergency Department presentations. Please note that the department does not see paediatric patients nor those involved in major trauma.</p> <p>- The department manages patients in a range of clinical areas including a resuscitation area, central area, rapid assessment unit, and extended observation unit. The SJUH Emergency Department also co-runs a Same Day Emergency Care (SDEC) service with the acute medical team.</p>
Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>F2 doctors work as part of the multidisciplinary team in all areas of the department and would be expected to see, assess and management patients with close support and supervision from senior colleagues.</p> <p>Learning Opportunities include: -Weekly half-day teaching sessions (disturbance free).</p>

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Active educational and clinical supervision with ample opportunities for completing WBPAs. - Shop floor consultant 'Clinical Educators' for dedicated shop floor teaching - Weekly in-situ simulation sessions for trainees. -Substantial induction package with clinical e-learning course 'Foundations of Emergency Medicine' - Self Development Time built into the rota pattern.

Main duties of the placement	<p>Assess, investigate and manage patients presenting with a wide range of conditions in all areas of the Emergency Department.</p> <p>Refer and discharge patients with appropriate follow up as needed.</p> <p>Work as part of a large multi-disciplinary team including foundation doctors, GP trainees, ACCS and Emergency Medicine trainees, ACPs and PAs.</p>

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	Provide excellent level of care to all patients under the active supervision of a pro-active senior team. There is 24 / 7 shop floor consultant presence at the LGI ED.
Typical working pattern in this placement	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- The F2 roster involved a variety of shifts (day/mid/evening and nights).- Night shifts are worked in blocks of 3 and 4.- Weekend work at a ratio of 1 in 3.
