Placement	Old Age psychiatry – inpatient dementia unit
Department	Ward G1 is an 16 bedded dementia assessment and treatment ward. The patients usually have very severe Behavioural & Psychiatric Symptoms of Dementia (BPSDs). The ward has a very high and complex level of clinical activity.
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Responsibilities include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Day to day care of all patients (admissions clerking & assessments, clinical review of physical health concerns, legible notes in medical records, prescribing, requesting investigations and actioning results). • Attending the twice weekly multidisciplinary team meeting. • Input into discharge planning – arranging discharge medications and writing discharge letters. • Being compliant with mandatory training requirements. • Attendance at FY1 teaching and ‘away days’. • Attendance at weekly trust teaching on Wednesday morning. • Attendance at weekly balint group. • Learning on the job – informal teaching from peers. • Leadership role in regards to FY1 • Participation in delivering teaching to other MDT members.

<p>Main duties of the placement</p>	<p>The FY1 doctor attached to Old Age Psychiatry will be based on the inpatient dementia ward (G1). They will work as part of a multidisciplinary team, providing most of the medical input. Main duties include clerking in new admissions, which includes assessment of their physical health status, assessing and managing physical health concerns of existing patients, attending the weekly multidisciplinary team meetings, completing discharge paperwork. They will share responsibility for patients with the FY1 doctor.</p>
<p>Typical working pattern in this placement</p>	<p>The standard working week for the FY2 on the ward is 09:00 to 17:00 Monday to Friday. In addition they have on-call responsibilities. The working pattern is arranged across a rota cycle of 17 weeks and includes: normal days, long day (weekdays), long day weekends and nights</p>
