**Aims of Post:**

- Develop further understanding of clinical leadership and engagement.
- Lead a quality improvement project looking at the obstetric clinical indicator of perineal trauma. Gain experience in 'leading change' process.
- Work with practice development midwives to develop and deliver multidisciplinary training. Coordinate and facilitate combined obstetric and neonatal live drills.
- Complete PGCert in Medical Leadership (SHU).

Summary of Post:

I worked closely with the Family Health Senior Management Team at Rotherham Foundation Trust and had the opportunity to develop insight into the structure and function of the organisation. The main focus of the post was to develop and lead a multi-intervention quality improvement project. The aim of the project was to improve the perineal outcomes for women giving birth through a multidisciplinary staff education and development programme focused on increasing practitioner awareness and addressing inconsistencies in approaches to prevent obstetric anal sphincter injury.

Achievements:**Projects and organisation**

- Planned and operationally delivered a quality improvement project called Perineum Protect and Prevent Project.
- Provided ongoing support and information to multidisciplinary team for continuous improvement.
- Improved patient engagement with development of patient experience videos to be used for staff training and education.
- Wrote a Business Case for Episcissors (included in NHS England Innovation and Technology Tariff) and presented at Trust's Business Investment Committee meeting. Secured investment and Episcissors successfully introduced end of June 2017.

- Updated local guidelines, patient information leaflets and labour and birth notes through collaboration with Trust's Graphics team.
- Collaboratively worked with Women's Health Physiotherapy team to improve postnatal care for women and enable patients to be reviewed on the ward or shortly after discharge.
- Worked with practice development midwives to develop and deliver mandatory multidisciplinary training.
- Established regular in-situ obstetrics simulation.
- Member of antenatal clinical transformation board, working to improve patient care and journey through antenatal services.
- Organised a multidisciplinary learning event called "Stop the Clot – Saving Mothers Lives" with international guest speaker Professor Catherine Nelson-Piercy.
