Department	<p>AMS</p> <p>Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust is a Tertiary referral centre for many cancers across Yorkshire & also a regional trauma centre.</p> <p>Department of Urology is staffed by 18 Consultants, 7 specialist Registrars, 2 Urological fellows, 4 CT Doctors & over 20 specialist nurses. The Department is in Chancellor wing 2nd floor near Geoffrey Giles theatre, where all secretaries & Consultant offices are based. Acute wards are SAU, wd42/43/44/45 & elective wards are all at Bexley wing (ward 91/92). Specialised cancer services like kidney /bladder /prostate/ penile & testicular are provided at SJUH & all Foundation trainees are based at SJUH. Robotic surgery is based at Lincoln theatres in SJUH. During on call LGI is covered for trauma & acutes. In addition to specialized cancer services Urology also provides complex stone, female & andrology services. There is specialized catheter service / flexible cystoscopy service at SJUH. Wharfedale Hospital (Otley) provides some day care surgeries which include Stone, andrology. Benign prostate surgery & superficial bladder tumour surgery. Multidisciplinary team meetings are usually held on Fridays</p>
The type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Ward based work both for elective & acute patients – Urology ward is J42. Ward round for acute & elective patients, requesting Investigations, ordering/ taking bloods for Investigations (phlebotomy service available day time) & treating patients with senior advice.</p> <p>Learning opportunities Catheter clinic run by specialist nurses on Monday PM at Paul Sykes OP clinic.</p> <p>Weekly Friday teaching by Specialist Registrar</p> <p>Monthly audit meeting with opportunity to present.</p> <p>One to one teaching during acute week, theatres & cystoscopy Taster days for specific interest</p>

<p>Main duties of the placement</p>	<p>The responsibilities of the FY1 would involve clinical review and management of patients in urology wards. FY1 doctor will be expected to attend ward round with Consultant & Registrar followed by clinical review & management of acute urology patients supported by CT doctors, Registrars & Consultant. There is a separate FY1 doctor for Elective patients but in case acutes are busy elective FY1 are expected to support acute service. Usually there are 2 FY1 doctors allocated for acute service all the time</p>
<p>Typical working pattern in this placement</p>	<p>Shift duties. Daytime starting at 8am & twilight starting at 2pm</p>
